

Wolf Creek Trail Map

Orange Trail- is a short trail (400 feet) that descends the slope forest to a bench with a scenic view overlooking the floodplain and slope forest's sweeping display of colorful trout lilies. Sit a spell and take in one of the best views. The orange trail also connects to the yellow and pink trails.

Yellow Trail- is a 1/2 mile open loop. The trail traverses the main population of trout lilies along the upper slope of the beech-magnolia forest with scattered displays of trilliums, violets, bloodroot, jack-in-the-pulpit and twayblade orchids. Along the way there is a bench at a scenic vista point before the trail descends to the lower trail and an overlook of Wolf Creek. The lower trail traverses the edge of the slope and floodplain forests with continued displays of colorful trout lilies and then connects to the Pink Trail. The lower trail can be soggy at times, but is a worthwhile and fun adventure.

Pink Trail- is a moderate 4/10 mile open loop that connects to the lower yellow trail, and the middle and upper orange trail. The lower portion of the trail supports a thick carpet of trout lilies and connects to a spur trail through the floodplain to a magnolia tree with green fly orchids. The trail has a mildly sloping upper component of hardwood forest and supports a rich diversity of flora including trillium, beech-drops, needle palms and Elliott's Blueberry bushes.

White Trail- is a moderate 1/3 mile open loop that connects to the primary woods road leading back to the parking area. Approximately halfway along the trail is a small group of mid-story Strawberry Bushes that are a unique botanical feature at Wolf Creek. The trail also supports an understory of numerous trilliums. The overall length of the white trail-woods road loop is approximately 1 mile.
